



Morning concerts are a regular feature of the Indian music scene, and offer both a rare opportunity to hear the morning raga repertory and a perfect opportunity to share the music with family and friends.



We begin this concert with Seema and Vishwanath Shirodkar taking centre stage as 'Swar-Tala Duo'. Harmonium and Tabla are both traditionally treated as 'accompanying' instruments, although there is a long tradition of tabla solo performance: harmonium solo is a newer phenomenon, but a revelation for music-lovers in the hands of a brilliant musician such as Seema Shirodkar. In this part we will enjoy the beautiful and energising music of these two masters.



The second item will be a khyal presentation by Chiranjeeb Chakraborty. A native of Kolkata currently based in London, Chiranjeeb's style blends elements of different khyal gharanas which he has absorbed from his eminent teachers.

A unique evening of sitar, orchestra and choral music.

Conducted by Harish Shankar, the Orchestra and Chorus of Opera North join forces for this wide-ranging and powerful concert. At its heart is a newly commissioned concerto from composer and sitar virtuoso Jasdeep Singh Degun, in which the complex rhythms and gorgeous melodies of Indian

classical raag strike up conversations with the orchestra, as the sitar by turns draws in, creates quickfire exchange with and finally comes harmoniously together with the orchestra.

The concerto is paired with the full force of the Chorus of Opera North, whose programme includes the delicately beautiful Humming Chorus from Puccini's Madama Butterfly, Purcell's exquisite Dido's Lament, extracts from La traviata and The Magic Flute, and concludes with Vaughan Williams' Serenade to Music.

Scottish classical guitarist/composer Simon Thacker's innate gift for reinvention and expansion comes together with one of the sub continent's spiritually and musically richest forms. The group features Bangladeshi Baul singer Farida Yesmin, singer and khomok virtuoso Raju Das Baul, from the Indian Baul heartland of Santiniketan, and Kolkata's Sunayana Ghosh, one of a growing number of exceptional female tabla exponents.




